Food and Farm Plan

Iowa Legislature 2010 Amendment:

“To the extent feasible, the Leopold Center for Sustainable Agriculture established pursuant to section 266.39 shall prepare a local food and farm plan containing policy and funding recommendations for supporting and expanding local food

systems for assessing and overcoming obstacles necessary to increase locally grown food production. The Leopold Center for Sustainable Agriculture shall submit the plan to the general assembly by January 10, 2011. The plan shall include recommendations for short-term and long-term solutions, including but not limited to the enactment of legislation.”

Good news! For the past six months the Leopold Center has engaged over 1000 people in 95 of Iowa’s 99 counties to get feedback on what should be in the plan. It will be delivered as scheduled. On Jan. 20 they have arranged a public briefing to provide an overview of the plan, along with brief remarks by legislators, state agency and educational institution representatives, farmers, processors, and buyers of local food.

Food Safety Workshop: Feb. 9, @ Wilber Aalfs Library, Sioux City

As you know, the food safety law passed by Congress on Dec. 21, 2010 aims to ensure the U.S. food supply is safe by shifting the focus of federal regulators from responding to contamination to preventing it ([FDA](#)). Although the new bill includes some protections and

exemptions for small farm operations, food safety is an important topic for all sizes. We have yet to see how the new regulations will affect us, so plan for prevention! [The Good Agricultural Practices \(GAP\) and On-Farm Food Safety Workshop](#) can be your ticket to preparing for new food safety regulation and ensuring food quality on your farm. The training will cover information in microbial

risks, food safety culture & the regulatory landscape, production safety issues, and post harvest handling for both organic and conventional farming methods. You will begin documentation of your personal on-farm safety plan and learn about GAP audits SOP’s and traceability.
